## May President's Message

Lee Cheatle is the dynamic president of the very successful Bonsai Society of Portland. BSOP has over 300 members and it is not unusual for 100 or more to attend a given meeting. As part of some communication that I had with Lee recently, he sent me an article that he has written for the ABS Journal, addressing his thoughts on what makes a successful bonsai club. The following is a quote from that article:

***"At this time I need to emphasize, and all of you know, a club's entire success comes down to four absolutes. The first three are: active volunteers, ongoing good communication with quality information, and getting along. Getting along is bolstered by understanding that egos are left at the door and that the good of the whole is first and foremost."***

***"And now for the fourth absolute. This is key and I believe you may possess it if you are still reading this article: Passion! Not everyone in your club will have it, but if you have a few that do, put them out in front and let them run; passion can be highly infectious."***

I was especially taken with Lee's fourth absolute because it resonates with my own belief about the practice of bonsai. When we have leaders in our organization who are truly fired up about the art form and can convey that level of enthusiasm and commitment, we create an atmosphere within our membership that is contagious.

We experience that passion when we listen to former president Paul Gilbert talk about viewing stones, when we listen to experienced collectors in our club talk about

the excitement of discovering fantastic yamadori in our native mountains, or when we are privileged to be part of a presentation or workshop with talented guest bonsai artists. The passion we absorb in these situations inspires us to look anew at our own collections and to aspire to a higher level of practice.

As is true in virtually all organizations, there is a core group of members who have this level of commitment and passion for the art form, and there are many others whose interest may be more casual. My hope is that, even for those who treat bonsai as a

casual hobby, the enthusiasm and passion exuded by our leaders will permeate all of the programs and activities of RMBS, making bonsai a really exciting part of our lives.

By the way, one of Lee Cheatele's least favorite phrases is, "We've always done it that way."
