April President's Message

Learning About Bonsai

Perhaps the most important goal of the Rocky Mountain Bonsai Society is to educate our members about the art of bonsai, and to facilitate their ability to grow and expand that knowledge. Above all else, our club should be a vehicle for learning about bonsai.

In our last executive board meeting we had a lively discussion about how we can best accomplish that goal. I think we all appreciate that not every RMBS member has the same personal motivations or objectives. Some view bonsai as a casual pastime or hobby, and others see it as a larger commitment, in terms of time, energy and involvement. Whatever your intentions,

RMBS can be a resource for expanding your understanding and appreciation of this remarkable art form.

When we think about bonsai education, we often focus on formal classes or hands-on workshops. These are certainly important, and they are a key reason why we implemented the Bonsai Basics classes, providing a solid foundation for those members who are just getting started with bonsai practice. But the question always arises, "Where do I go from there?" How do we keep members involved and motivated to expand their knowledge?

Several ideas and suggestions evolved from our board discussion. First, we need to look into making Bonsai Basics a *series* of classes

during the course of the year, not just one session; there needs to be a progression. Second, we need to emphasize the array of educational resources that are available to members who are beyond a novice level and want to grow. In order to maximize the benefit of these resources, it's important that individual members take the initiative to utilize them, and to understand that, together, they can yield a set of effective vehicles for expanding knowledge. Here are some pertinent examples:

- Every RMBS meeting has a primary learning focus. Some are inspirational, such as Larry Jackel's presentation on the Doug Paul collection. Others are more how-to, such as an upcoming program on collecting trees from the wild. The short program in every meeting is often focused on an "inspiration tree", with a presentation by the owner of its history and development.
- For guest bonsai artist presentations we have purposely shied away from the traditional styling "demonstration" and are focusing instead on analysis and design recommendations for trees submitted by members.
- Guest artist workshops are terrific opportunities for members to do hands-on work on one of their trees under the direction of a bonsai professional. An added benefit for less experienced members is to attend as observers, soaking up the information provided during the discussion of each tree.
- Saturday club workshops, taught by accomplished club members from spring to fall, typically focus on important bonsai skills, such as correct procedures for repotting, wiring, tree analysis and styling, etc., in a hands-on setting. Often these sessions are held at the homes of individual members, affording the opportunity to see their collections.
- Several RMBS members are accomplished collectors of *yamadori* (wild trees from the mountains). They have outstanding pre-bonsai stock available for purchase and can advise you on how to care for these specimens. We also have members who are excellent creators of bonsai containers and display stands.
- Every Wednesday morning, virtually year-round, Larry Jackel hosts and mentors a bonsai study group at the DBG Chatfield Farms greenhouse and the DBG Bonsai Pavilion during summer months. These informal workshops are open to any RMBS member.
- Mentorships with experienced club members are available; just ask. A number of senior club members are more than willing to work with newer people on a regular basis to coach and advise them about how to develop their trees and expand their horizons.
- RMBS owns an extensive library of bonsai books and periodicals that are available for loan at every meeting. Our annual budget includes a generous allowance for regular acquisition of new materials.

- Finally, the internet is an extremely valuable source of bonsai knowledge. As we redevelop our website, we will continue to make our members aware of the best and most valuable of these, such as the newly formed weekly live stream from Ryan Neil's Bonsai Mirai (see separate article in this newsletter from Adam Johnson).

My point in mentioning all of this is simply to remind everyone that there are a myriad of ways for you to expand your knowledge of bonsai, at whatever level or intensity you choose. The resources are there, but you must take the initiative. If you are hungry to learn, the opportunities are out there, and you will not be disappointed!
